CITIZENS WILL BUILD PIPELINE

PLAN PRIVATE COMPANY

Will Buy Water From City Water Works at City Limits And Resell to United States Gypsum Company—Charter Will Be Applied for and Incorporated Under Laws of State.

TO CARRY INJUNCTION FIGHT TO THE HIGHER COURTS

Board of City Development Retains Counsel to Aid City Attorney A. B. Yantis-Douthit, Mays and Perkins Retained By U. S. Gypsum Co. Other Attorneys Volunteer Service

With one of the most heartening exhibitions of public spiritedness this city has ever exhibited, citizens have responded to the call to action and by private subscription will construct the pipe line from the Eastern boundary of the city to the plant of the United States Gypsum Company.

The plan worked out by the committee from the Board of City Development composed of leading attorneys of the city with R. M. Chitwood, provides for the formation of a stock company to construct the pipe line-with the understanding that as soon as the city legally can, it will take over the said pipe line.

There are several ways in which this can be done. One of them is by the extension of the city limits and another is by carrying the injunction proceedings into Superior Courts. In case of a reversal, then the cty could go ahead with its original plans.

TO CORRECT THE RECORD.

In Thursday's issue of The Reporter, July 19th, it was stated that the contention of the attorneys for the city and the United States Gypsum Company were founded solely upon Article 771 of the Revised Civil Statutes, whereas, as a matter of fact, it was contended that the statutory basis by which the city had the power to construct the pipe line and sell water was based upon all of the following articles:

"Article 769-Powers Of City, Etc. Owning water works, sewers, gas and electric lights, to own land within or week's meeting at the Nolan school without limits. Any town or city in house last week this state, which may have been or may hereafter be chartered or organized under the general laws of Texas, Sunday to church. or by special act of charter, and which city or town owns or operates water works, sewers, gas or electric thrashing grain this week near Sweet 65 cents in change. Finder leave at light shall have the power and right to own land for such purposes, within or without the limits of such town or city. (Acts 1909, p. 159.)

"Article 770-May Purchase, Construct and operate systems inside or outside limits, and regulate, etc .-Such town or city may purchase, construct and operate water, sewer and gas, and electric light systems, maide or outside of such towa or city lim-Its, and regulate and control same, in a manner to protect the interests of such town or city, (1d. sec. 1.)


"Article 771-May Sell Water, Etc., to Persons Outside, Permit Connec tions. Etc.-Such town or city shall have the power and right to sell water, gas, electric lights or power and sewer privaleges to any person or corporation cutside of the limits of said town or city, and to permit them to connect therewith under contract with such town or city, under such terms and conditions as may appear to be for the best interests of such town or city. (1d. sec. 1.)"



AN ORDINANCE.

Commissioner No. 2, that paragraph No. two (2) of Section three (3) of "an ordinance pertaining to electric wiring and electric apparatus" adopted and approved by the City Council of Sweetwater, August 16th, 1916, be amended so that paragraph No. 2 (2) of Section three (3) thereof shall read as follows:

The City electrician may inspect or cause to be inspected any old wiring or electrical apparatus in any building within the corporate limits of the City of Sweetwafer, and shall thereupon issue a certificate if the work is in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. In case the work does not comply with this ordinance, the city electrician shall issue a written statement as to the changes necessary to bring the work up to standard.


Under no consideration shall a certificate be issued on work that is concealed in such manner that it cannot be examined.
