Why is it that, immediately upon hearing the words, "drought" or "inflation," retail store owners will raise the prices of the goods on their shelves?



Mr. and Mrs. Johnson showed the group a very nice time during the tour. There were many spring flowers and plants and several of the members purchased flowers.


