They made up the two million people who were, at no cost to themselves, part of the audience that heard the performance.

Pound of Sugar Costs More Than Some Jewels

Sugars that cost from \$75 to \$375 per pound, because of the excessive care required to make them, are used in scientific laboratories. One is useful in detecting typhoid germs, as these tiny organisms multiply rapidly when feeding on it. A sugar, made from corn cobs, brings \$120 per pound, while another, manufactured from scraps left over in making vegetable buttons, sells for \$140.

Sir Walter Raleigh's First Pipe Shown in London

Sir Walter Raleigh's first pipe with which he is believed to have introduced tobacco smoking in England, has recently been found in London. Made by American Indians, and decorated with carved heads of people and animals, it is said that he smoked it on the eve of his execution.

Soviet Picture Cars Draw Interest of Peasants

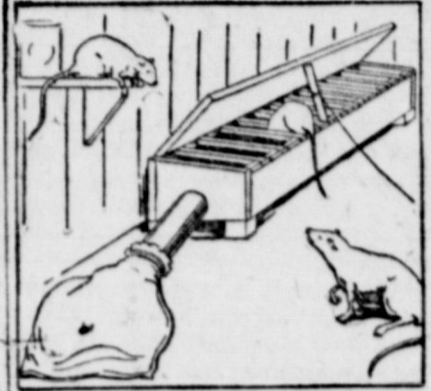
By sending trains of picture cars into the rural districts, the Russian government is attempting to educate in the principles of communism more than 100,000,000 people who, heretofore, have shown little or no interest in politics. Painted on the sides of the railroad cars by the nation's most skilled artists, are propaganda and educational designs illustrating the communistic doctrines. In trying to "sell" this form of government to the peasants, the Soviets probably have become the world's largest advertisers.

Fifteen Years Added To Span Of Life In Past Fifty

Figures have been compiled showing that the average length of life for inhabitants of the United States has increased almost 15 years in the past 53. In 1870, the average was 41 years, while now it is almost 56. By 1950, the span will have reached the biblical threescore and ten, provided the present high standards of civilization and correct living are maintained, a scientist has predicted. In the 16th century the ordinary term of life was between 18 and 20 years, and about 1800, it was still less than 25 years. At the end of the 19th century, it was between 45 and 48 years.

Poultry Feeder and Rat Trap

A combination rat trap and dry-mash feeder is a rather novel addition to the poultry house. The feeder is a long box, 1 ft. high and 1 ft. wide, with a sloped and slatted top, through which the hens put their heads to eat during the day. To convert this into a rat trap, a 4-in. hole was bored in the end of the hopper, a short length of 4-in. stovepipe fastened in the hole, and a bag tied over the other end of the pipe and spread out on the ground. A heavy board cover was hinged to the feed box; this was kept open by means of a hook during the day, but the hook was released, and a small prop with a string attached to it used at night. The string led away to a distant window so that the poultryman could pull it without entering the poultry house and disturbing the rats. A yank at the string led the cover drop and trapped the rats inside. Then, by beating



on the cover with a stick, the rats were made to run through the hole, down the pipe, and into the bag, where a few blows killed them. As long as the hens ate from the feeder the rats never seemed suspicious.

When examining the storage battery of a car to see if any water is needed, do not simply test one cell, examine them all. One of the cells may be cracked, and will require water often than the others. It is a good idea to examine a storage battery once every two weeks. In adding distilled water to the battery, always bring the level of the electrolyte 1/2 in. above the top of the plates.

One thousand, four hundred and nineteen eggs from eighty-five hens. WEST TEXAS NOTES. In the month of September, is not so bad after all. And it is fine when one understands that those eighty-five hens were March pullets. Eggs would average around 25 cents for September. 1419 eggs amount to over 118 doz. At the average price that meant \$29.50 to the owner. Fred Moore, Fred lives right here in town and keeps his hens in a close pen.—Hamlin Herald.

This is fire prevention week, and it is the duty of every citizen of Sweetwater to see that all rubbish is cleaned up and disposed of. Many fires in the United States are caused by accumulated rags and trash.

The year 1922 recorded the greatest fire waste ever known in the United States with a property loss of \$521,860,000. The fire loss in this country is \$4.75 per capita while in Europe the loss is approximately 33 cents. Carelessness is responsible for most fires—carelessness about equipping buildings, providing fire protection and enforcing fire prevention ordinances.

A clean city will have few fires. Attics and cellars should be kept free from combustible accumulations. Don't deposit ashes in wood boxes carelessly, against wooden fences or other combustible materials. Burning trash or autumn leaves too near a house or building is dangerous. The careless use of pipes, cigars and cigarettes causes countless fires.

officials of the United States Gypsum Co. are advertising everywhere for men, trying to get a construction crew of several hundred men together to rush the plant to completion. In addition to carrying ads for men in the West Texas papers, newspapers in Ft. Worth, Dallas, Houston, New Orleans and other points are also carrying the word.

A part of the foundation work concrete has already been poured for the plaster mill in the middle of a big cotton patch and structures in which to house the workmen are already being erected at the plant site. The switch to the plant site has been labeled "Pyramid" by the T-P officials but that don't mean anything locally. "Injunction City" it is called and Harry Cress, who has taken the contract for feeding the imported laborers unavailable locally, has been elected mayor unanimously.

A few miles further down, near Pacific, work on the switch into the gypsite deposits just over the line into Fisher County is proceeding rapidly.

And a payroll of several hundred men is just awaiting construction of that pipe line!

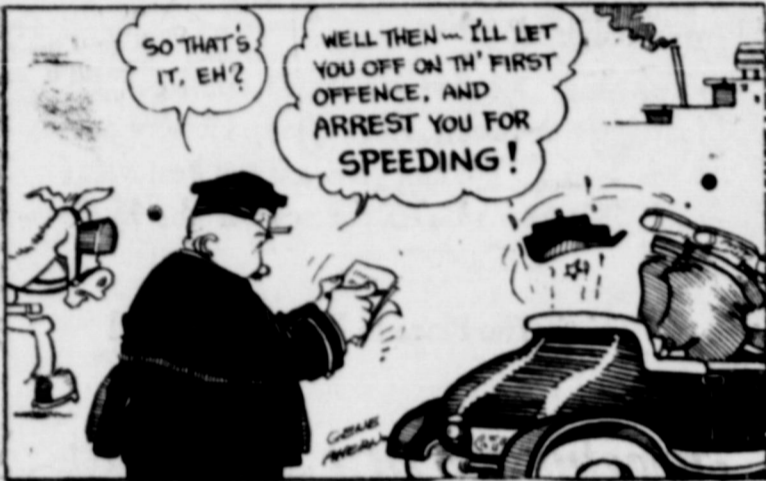
