Taxpayers provided one teacher for 14.6 students in Friona ISD
while the statewide pupil-teacher ratio was 17.1 to one. Because of
ratale the existence of small classes, especially at the high school level,
and abbreviated schedules, many other classes have more than the average number of students.
To fund higher school budgets
with a declining tax base, school
trustees in most districts have raised tax rates. The average school district imposed a property $\$ 100$ of apte of 91.2 cents per value averaged $96.5 \%$ of market value (selling price). The "true tax rate was 88.1 cents ( 91.2 times
Locally, the Friona ISD imposed a rate of 77 cents while property market value making the true rate 71.6 cents per $\$ 100$ of market value (selling price).
The report points out that the calculation of a true tax rate based appraised value enables a valid comparison of tax levels with other exceeded $\$ 1$ in 336 schol dax rate in Texas.

The tax on a house that would
sell for $\$ 80,000$ in Friona ISD would have been $\$ 510$. If the homestead exemptions, the tax would have been $\$ 472$, and if owned by a person 65 years or in this district on an $\$ 80,000$ house in this district would have averaged

$3.7 \%$ for $1988-89$ as compared to a $6.8 \%$ increase statewide. Local property taxes plus state aid was $\$ 3,167$ per student in Friona ISD as compared to $\$ 3,211$
statewide. The primary purpose of state aid is to equalize state and local tax resources among schools. In 1988-89 tax resources ranged from less than $\$ 2,500$ per student
in 12 districts to more than $\$ 10,000$

The objective of the grant establishing the "Demonstration Partnership Program" is to stimulate
Community Action Agencies to develop new ideas for decreasing the dependency of the economically disadvantaged on welfare programs, or persons who qualify by Department of Health and Human Service income take low income, single heads of households and provide short-term training in non-traditional occupations. Participants will then be placed in employment.
