rigid, hostile, humorless, rigid, hostile, humorless, have a lot of friends who believe everything they believe. The third type is well informed and open-minded. They know that

pay more attention to the positive aspects of living and are tolerant kind and gentle. They are measured in their thinking and they're always learning and
