Is Member Prominent New York Law Firm-Expected Senate Will Confirm the Appointment

By The Uinted Press.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 2. -Marlan Fiske Stone, former dean of Columbia law school, has been selected as Attorney General of the United States by President Coolidge.

Official announcement of the selection was made today and Stone's nomination was sent to the Senate for confirmation.

He was President Coolidge's guest at breakfast at the White House this morning. Several Senators were there also, and although Mr. Coolidge did not tell any of them that Stone had been N selected, they got the impression that he was to be the next Attorney General.

Stone was a class-mate of Coolidge at Amherst College and the two are old friends.

The new Attorney General is accepting the post at a tremendous sacrifice. He is a member of a prominent law firm in New York and is on leave from the Columbia law school. Stone's nomination is expected to be
