City Commission Discusses Dangers of Bowie and Lamar Street Crossings at Regular Meet

Report Auditing Committee on File-Pass Ordinance Requiring All Dogs to be Muzzled

Elimination of railroad crossing death traps on Lamar and Bowie streets where they pass over the Texas & Pacific railway tracks, a move that means much to the citizens of Sweetwater has been undertaken by Mayor Joe H. Boothe and the City Thursday at the regular semi-month-

Thursday and it was learned that when she refused to buy his wares. Mayor Boothe has already been in communication with officials of the railroad relative to the construction of an underground passageway at either Bowie or Lamar street, or poseither Bowie or Lamar street, or possibly both. The work of erecting an BARED IN SENA overhead viaduct crossing at one of the streets also has been discussed.

Owing to the heavy traffic over these crossings the dangers of railroad accidents are ever apparent, and, according to plans now maturing, every effort will be made to remedy the situation.

It also announced at the meeting that the official audit of the City administration's books has been completed. The balance sheet, containing numerous items of interest to every citizen, will be published Sunday. At the conclusion of the audit, made by Messrs. Thomas & Pickup, New York accountants, Mr. Thomas said:

"It iss indeed gratifying to be able to furnish you with a clear certificate after finding the corporation's affairs in such a healthy condition. With losses in the sinking fund through failure of the Trammell Bank, fully recovered, and the statement of the city's financial condition as reflected by the balance sheet, our audit should serve to satisfy every citizen or the true condition existing in the ac-

counts." The report is on file at the City Hall, where it can be inspected. Another item of importance was

acted upon Thursday when the commissioners passed an emergency ordinance, effective immediately, prohibiting dogs running loose without being muzled. The ordinance provides that dogs not muzzled will be impounded and if at the end of three days their owners have not called for them, will be shot. This action was taken as a precautionary measure against mad dogs. The ordinance apears in another page of this paper and also will be published again Sunday.


Perhaps there are times when speed is justifiable. It might be so construed in the story that W. T. Hightower tells of early days in Sweetwater:




