BURKETT FLAILS LYNCH DAVIDSON

Attacks His Railroad Record and Objects Strenuously to Program of Tax Remission

OPPOSED TO

Senator From Eastland Speaks in Behalf of Candidacy For Governor Here Monday Night

Speaking in the District Courtroom, which was filled, Senator Joe Burkett of Eastland, gave an address in the interests of his candidacy for governor Monday night.

JACKSON, Miss., May 27 .- A tornado which swept sections of Mississippi during the night took a heavy toll in life and property damage, according to reports received here today.

Between 25 and 30 were reported killed and two score injured in Mississippi and Alabama. 
