Italian Airman Had Been Adrift in Icey Seas Three Days and Nights War Department Believes.

FORCED DOWN BY

Cruiser Richmond Picks Up Flyer and Mechanic-U. S. Aviators Soon in North America.

By The Untied Press.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 25 .--Lt. Locatelli, the Italian aviator who has been missing since Thursday, has been picked up by the U. S. S. Richmond, off the coast of Greenland, the Army Air Service was advised offi-

cially today. A dispatch received by naval radio at 11:24 last night. The dispatch read:

"Locatelli found latitude 59 degrees 56 minutes, longitude 39 degrees 48 minutes. Sighted at 11:24 p. m. All well."

The latitude and longtitude stated in the message is just off the West coast of Greenland, according to naval officials. The finding of the Italian flyer who became lost while accompanying the American world flyers on a perilous hop from Iceland to Greenland Thursday afternoon had been pursued by American destroyers, airplanes, and motor boats for more than three days.

The message was interpreted as meaning that the Italian had been forced down in the heavy fog arising


