Sweetwater's share of a statewide rain broke West Texas rain records for many years when 3.53 inches of rain had been reported here by noon Friday. With the skies still cloudy and a drizzle continuing, more than 24 hours of steady rain was in pros-

Starting with a slow, steady downpour early Thursday night, rain fell in Sweetwater throughout the night and totaled 3.23 inches at 8 o'clock Friday morning, according to the register of the Sweetwater Vulcanizing Co., volunteer weather observers. This brings the total rainfall of the year to 15.79 inches as compared with 23.72 inches for the same period in 1924. The mercury had fallen to 56 degrees at 9 o'clock Friday morning.




