Manchurian Dietator Takes Personal
Charge of Armies in Attempt to
Overthrow Government.

SHANGHAI, China, Sept. 16.
General Tso Lin, Manchurian
dictator, has assumed personal
command of his armies invading
Chi Mukden in an effort to over-
throw the Pekin government, ac-
cording to advises received here
tonight.
