Officials pointed out today, that the weekly pass system not only eliminated a large number of transfers but the company made a bet with the patrons. If a pass buyer rides more than 17 times during the week, he is getting iis transporiation below the established 7 1-2 cent fare. If he rides less than 17 times during the seven days, the company wins.
