Highway South to Avoid Wildcat Mountain-Construction Progressing on Bankhead Project.

County Commissioners are advertising for bids for the construction of twelve miles of earth work on State Brent Glasscock, Leader of Roundout Highway No. 70, beginning at the top of Wildcat mountain and extending southward on the road to Blackwell. This work will consist of grading, THOUSANDS drainage structure, rock base and asphalt top. The bids will be opened on Currency and Bills Identified Total December 19.

This is the second project in Nolan County's State Highway construction program. Work is now actively under way grading the road between Sweetwater and Roscoe. This work will be continued to the Nolan-Mitchell County line under the contract recently let.

Plans for the road east of Sweetwater to the Taylor County line are now in Austin being checked by State Highway engineers. When approved by them and by Federal Highway engineers, it will be advertised and contract let. It is expected that the contract can be let on this stretch shortly after the first of the year.

\$531,000-Accuses Fahy of Promoting Job.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 19 .-Currency, Liberty Bonds, and commercial paper with a total value of \$531,000 was brought into court tday as part of the evidence in the trial of William Fahy, former postal inspector, and two Chicago politicians, charged with plotting the Roundout, Ill., \$3,000,000 mail robbery last June.

Brent Glasscock, leader of the pandit gang, identified the money as part of the loot. Glasscock, who confessed, testified for the government, and charged that Mahy furnished the information as to registered money shipments and train movements.

Glasscock said \$404,000 in bonds, \$7,500 in unsigned money, and \$17,barn on South Peoria Street, in Tulsa, Okla. The barn is owned by a Van Cleve family, he said.

KULL FRACTURE OTHER INJURIES

Mrs. W. H. Whaley and John A. Violence and Bloodshed Feared in Victim Unconscious During Day—Tried To Stop For Crossing, Fireman Says-Second Recent Crossing Accident.

> At three o'clock Wednesday afternoon W. H. Bartlett remained in a semi-conscious condition. Attending physicians had not operated and stated that they would not unless developments made it necessary. Drs. Rosebrough and Fortner were in attendance on the injured man throughout the day. Dr. Root of Colorado was also called in consultation. His condition is described as very serious. The principal injury is skull fractured at the base. There is also a possibility of injury to the back but this has not yet been definitely determined. Mr. Bartlett has never completely lost consciousness since the accident, nor has he been completely conscious at any time.

Henry Bartlett, 48, for 14 years Secretary of the City of Sweetwater, was injured at about 8 o'clock Wednesday morning, when the automobile in which he was riding was struck by west bound Texas and Pacific passenger train No. 5 at the Hailey street crossing.

The injuries included a crushed skull and severe bruises about the face, but physicians expressed hopes for his recovery late Wednesday.

In general there are three ways of ncreasing crop yields. One is by horticulture which seeks to improve the old kinds of cultivated food plants and create new ones. In this line of effort, Luther Burbank took a leading place. What he accomplished by plant breeding has won the gratitude of all people, especially Americans.

Mechanical efficiency is another way to increase agricultural production. Farm machinery has been improved until any farmer who hopes to succeed in his business must invest considerable capital in appliances for sowing, reaping and cultivation of crops. It is this way that he is able to overcome, to some extent, the scarcity of labor and the high wages demanded by employes on the farms.





been laid out. The present grade of approximately 12 per cent will be reduced to a maximum of six per cent and that only for a short distance. It will probably be late in the winter before these plans can be completed and receive the approval of the State and Federal highway engineers.

It is probable that this highway will cross under the Santa Fe railway at a point northwest from the present grade crossing, pass west of the city dump ground, cross the west end of the Country Club grounds and

The road west of Sweetwater is closed with detour signs well marked around where construction is actively under way. All motorists are advised to use this detour as they are not supposed to pass where road gangs are at work.

One motorist who grumbled about trying to get through where the teams were working said they would not turn out for him. He was told that the contract did not provide for time lost by teams turning out for 500 to 700 automobiles a day and that motorists should use the detour.
