Texas Boy Dies With Secret of Slayer on Lips-"I Won't Squawk," Last Words.

ST. PAUL, Minns Nov. 28 .-Just plain grit sealed the lips of Louis Younger, 19 year old Texas hoy, who died last night at St. Luke's hospital from mysterious bullet wounds. "I won't squawk," he whispered as he closed his eyes for the last time.

These were the first words that he had uttered to contradict his story of accidentally wounding himself since he was brought to the hospital two weeks ago. The theory is now that he was wounded in a gun battle duel or shot by someone he at least knew.

Thousands of tourists and visitors are drawn to Oklahoma by its great game reserve. In the Wichita National Forest and Game Reserve near Lawton, Oklahoma, there is a natural park of more than 60,000 acres of granite hills, mountains, woodland and clear streams. In it thrive all kinds of wild life, herds of buffalo, elk and antelope, flocks of wild turkeys and numbers of native deer.

The forest was made a game serve by the National Government in 1907 and was stocked with animals. Eight thousand acres were fenced for a pasture for the bison. Thirty miles of improved roads now lead through all parts of the reserve.






