The sale of stock began immediately and during the first month more than \$50,000 dollars worth of installment stock was sold. After the first month, no further stock selling efforts were made, although the first of this year saw over \$110,000 worth of stock in the hands of Sweetwater citizens.

Those familiar with the workings By The United Press. realize, however, that one hundred stock sold does not mean that much money in the hands of the treasurer. Installment stock is paid for at the rate of fifty cents per share per month, or five dollars a month on the thousand. On a regular payment basis, then, \$100,000 of installment stock would mean \$6,000 paid in to the treasurer during a full twelve months.
