United States Coast Guard Gets Two Rum Ships, Three Trucks, 800 Cases Whiskey.

Coast Guard Open Fire With Rifles When Smugglers Discovered While On Patrol.

GALVESTON, Jan. 13,-In a running gun battle with rum smugglers, United States coast guard today captured two rum ships, three armored trucks, 890

cases of liquor and two men. The battle was staged seven miles east of San Luis pass on Galveston Island. Several of the smugglers, estimated to be a dozen in number, were wounded. There were no casualties among the members of the Coast Guard.

Under the command of Wm. Steir part, the Coast Guard was patroling BEGIN near the shore when they noticed two the rum runners with rifles, the smugglers returning the fire with revolvers. After a sharp interchange of shots, the rum runners deserted their cargos and sped away in two large touring cars.

Two large high-powered motor launches and three armored trucks were captured. The trucks were protected by steel plates. Two of them were loaded with whiskey and the other with gin.






