Research and Construction Underway For Two Crafts Larger Than America's "Los Angeles."

BUILD OF STEEL

Ships Will Be First Built of All Steel -Plan Passenger and Mail Air Service.

LONDON; Jan. 16 .- The British air nammoths R-100 and R-101, each twice as large as the American "Los Angeles" are planned to be weatherproof, accident-proof, and fool-proof.
