FILTER PLANT IS

First Test to New Plant Sunday When Lake Trammell Water Turned Into \$10,000 Device.

START OPERATING FEB. FIRST

Description of Process Which Will Purify City Water Supply Presented Herewith.

The first test was made of Sweetwater's new \$40,000 filteration plant Sunday when the water was turned nto the huge mixing plant and allowed to run through the entire prosa which, when permanently opened all give to the city a bountiful supply clear, pure water free from all erms and foreign matter.

The test was very satisfactory, mer commissioner Musgrove said, and when the plant is completed it is believed that everything will be in and class working order and the process of filtering the city's water will continue without trouble. The test was made under the supervision of commissioner Musgrove, Ed Morey, who is installing the machinery, and outs Geldert, who will have actual charge of the plant when it begins

Huge pumps located in the pump ouse adjacent to the filtration plant bring the water down from Lake Frammell, through the various filter hambers and up into the stand pipe. the plant when completed will have capacity of one million gallons of ater a day, Musgrove said.

The water first comes from the Lake to the mixing chamber where a mical solution is added. The water and chemicals are thoroughly mixed in the first chamber from which it runs into the settling basin. Both plants are built of concrete and are rather complicated in construction. 


