"I believed that he could and would get my husband out of prison. There was no other reason," Mrs. Cade de\_

McKnight, Mrs. Cade testified, had used his influence in Cade's behalf.

A. Arnold, employe of the Houston hotel in question, testified previously that Mrs. Cade and H. L. McKnight had registered at the hotel within ten minutes of each other in August in rooms 230 and 228 respectively.
