# West Texans Return Federal Prohibition Authorities to Investigate Wisconsin Senators From Long Search

BARREL Thousands Armed Men Return to Homes In Many West Texas Counties After Dramatic Search Reaches Its Climax.

> JOHNSON TELLS STORY

> Local Chief of Police and Other Officers In Hunt From Beginning-Body Morales Turned Over to Family at Merkel.

Nearly a thousand West Texans slipped their Winchesters and six shooters back into scabbards Thursday night and departed for their respective homes scattered throughout a dozen counties, with the satisfaction of seeing finis written on the bloody career of the Mexican, Lopez Morales, hunted down and finally riddled with bullets for the murder of Howard County Sheriff W. W. Satterwhite, and Deputy Sheriff George Reeves of Taylor County.

Hundreds of people, including the many posses and the entire population of the villages of Lawa and Ovalo, witnessed the last stand of the killer in a Santa Fe bunk car at Lawn Thursday afternoon. And hundreds followed the car bearing the dead body of Morales, into Abilene Thursday evening where it was paraded up and down the

streets and finally deposited upon the plaza in the center of the city. Late Thursday, the stiff body of the Mexican was taken to Merkel, dumped on a truck, and carried to the home of his people who live near Merkel. Morales had a wife and several children, and a mother and father, all of whom live near the little Taylor County city.


