Fort Worth Brokers Given Sentence In Federal Court at Texarkana-Use Mails to Defraud

TEXARKANA, Ark., May 13 .-Fines of \$4,000 each were assessed against G. M. McGrath and Leo Reardon, Fort Worth brokers, in Federal Court here today upon pleas of guilty of using the mails to defraud.

Thirteen other counts against the men were dismissed.

Reardon and McGrath were alleged to have sold more than one million dollars worth of stock in the Paul Vitex Oil & Refining Co., in the Eldorado field.

Vitex and Dr. Frederick Cook were amed as promoters in the indictment. Vitex's whereabouts are unknown. Cook is in the Leavenworth peniten-

GOES BACK FOR RETRIAL

Aided Dallas Police in Rounding Up Gang Robbers Then Given 35 Years For His Help

By United Press.

AUSTIN, May 13 .- Will Barnes, young Arkansas farmer, convicted at Dallas of robbery and sentenced to 25 years, was given another trial by the Court of Criminal Appeals today. The court declared that "to allow the conviction to stand would be intolerable."

Barnes took a course from a detective school and received a diploma. His first attempt to do detective work was made at Dallas while visiting a sister there. He got wise to a gang of robbers and notified police, and, under their instructions, worked in with

After they pulled a robbery, Barnes nade a report to the police chief. He. along with others of the gang, was arrested and convicted. Barnes reeived the highest punishment of all.




