eports from 284 cotton growers ring average yields of 161 pounds of lint per acre show an average cost sale price of 23 cents per pound. For potatoes in different sections of the country average production costs were below the average selling price, but the margin was less than in 1923.

Costs include charges for labor of the farmer and his family, and charge for the use of the land on a cash rental basis, so that where cost just equalled the price received the farmer was paid for his time and his investment. The yields on the farms reporting were generally higher than the average yields for the states reported by the division of crop and livestock estimates of the department.
