AVOIDING CRASHES This year's posters put forward by the safety committees to reduce accidents at grade crossings leave nothing to the imagination of those who try to beat the train to the crossing or rush upon the tracks without looking both ways and listening. They show a motor car that has been smashed by a fast-moving train, with dead or dying and fragments of the car distributed along the right of way. If there is any force in terrible warnings, this should prevail to save life. The no-more-war societies might gain an idea from this particular safety crusade. Instead of holding occasional meetings and adopting resolutions they ought to keep a few motory pictures before the populace showing what happens when the cannon begin to roar.

MARGIN SMALL The average cost last year of producing wheat on 4,616 farms distributed fairly well over the country was \$2.22 per bushel, compared with an average sale value of \$1.43 a bushel, the department of agriculture has announced. The average cost of the corn crop on 7,153 farms was 82 cents a bushel compared with a sale value of \$1.10 a bushel, and the average cost of oats on 5,509 farms was 50 cents a bushel compared with a sale value of 57 cents a bushel.

Reports from 284 cotton growers having average yields of 161 pounds of lint per acre show an average cost of 18 cents a pound and an average sale price of 23 cents per pound. For potatoes in different sections of the country average production costs were below the average selling price, but the margin was less than in 1923. Costs include charges for labor of the farmer and his family, and a charge for the use of the land on a cash rental basis, so that where cost just equalled the price received the farmer was paid for his time and his investment. The yields on the farms reporting were generally higher than the average yields for the states reported by the division of crop and livestock estimates of the department.

## RECIPES

**Brown Bread**  
4 cups sifted Graham flour.  
1 cup bread flour.

2 level teaspoons baking powder.  
½ level teaspoon soda.  
½ cup brown sugar.  
½ cup molasses.  
2 cups sour milk  
2 tablespoons sour cream  
1 egg

Sift flour, baking powder and soda together three times. Mix sugar and molasses thoroughly and add to the milk, cream and well beaten egg. Combine with flour mixture, beat well. Pour into two small, well greased bread pans, let stand for two hours, then bake in a moderate oven (350-400 F.) one hour.

## Nut Cookies

1-3 cup butter 2 eggs  
½ cup sugar ½ cup flour  
1 level teaspoon baking powder.  
3-4 cup chopped nuts  
1 teaspoon lemon juice.

Cream butter and add sugar and eggs well beaten. Sift flour and baking powder together. Add first mixture; then add nuts and lemon juice. Drop from a spoon on an unbuttered baking sheet, leaving an inch space between them. Sprinkle with chopped nuts and bake in a hot oven. This will make about two dozen cookies.

## Chocolate Fudge Cake

½ cup butter or margarin.  
1 cup sugar 1 egg  
2 squares melted chocolate  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 cups pastry flour  
2 level teaspoons baking powder  
1-4 level teaspoon salt  
1 cup milk

Cream together butter and sugar; add well beaten egg and melted chocolate. Sift together remaining dry ingredients and add to first mixture alternately with milk. Then add vanilla. Pour into shallow, oblong pan, about ½ inches deep, and bake thirty to forty minutes at 350 F. Frost with chocolate fudge or white boiled frosting.

## FOR A CHANGE TRY THESE RECIPES

### Chopped Beef in Cabbage Leaves

One pound chopped beef, 1 cup cooked rice, ½ cup bread crumbs, 2 eggs, onion juice, 1½ teaspoon salt. Mix ingredients in order given. Soak cabbage leaves in hot water until soft enough to handle. Fill with prepared mixture, and fasten with tooth picks. Sprinkle with salt and dredge with flour, then fry in fat. Pour over tomato sauce, cover and bake in a slow oven for two hours. Serve with tomato sauce.

### Lemon Cream Cake

3½ cups flour  
3 level tsp. baking powder  
½ cup butter  
½ cup sifted granulated sugar  
Juice ½ lemon  
Rind of 1 whole lemon  
1 cup cold water or milk  
Whites of 4 eggs.

Sift flour, then measure, add baking powder and sift three times. Cream butter and sift sugar thoroughly, add grated rind, then put lemon juice in cup, add water to make a full cup, now add flour and water, alternatively, beating thoroughly just fold in well-beaten whites of 4 eggs. Bake in a moderate oven thirty to thirty-five minutes at 325-400 F. Use lemon filling.

### Fruit Salad Dressing

2 eggs  
4 tsp sugar ½ tsp salt  
4 tsp vinegar 1 tsp mustard  
1 cup whipped cream

Combine the eggs, sugar and salt and beat until light. Then add the vinegar and mustard, beat again and cook over hot water until thick. Mix 1½ teaspoonsful of this foundation dressing with 1 cupful of whipped cream. If desired less sweet, the amount of sugar may be decreased. The foundation dressing will keep for several weeks in a cool place.
