MOTHER OBTAINS SEARCH LONDON SONS CONFESSION FOR LOST MAN

Killing-Persuaded by Mother To Confess

AWAITING

Charged With Murder of Friend-Confession Is The Chief Evidence Against Him

ST. LOUIS, July 22 .- Maury O' Flaherty, a nineteen-year-old product of St. Louis famous old Kerry Patch -where gang wars and street feuds once ruled—is in jail awaiting trial as Press today that Scotland Yard was a murder accessory as result of the preachings a parish priest taught his mother in "ould Ireland."

The mother, Bridget O'Flaherty, today is a sad-eyed, yet devout mother tives, the girl watched the swirling who believes she is "bearing her traffic of London to find the omnibus cross" as the priest taught her to. For she made her son confess to being Menday night.

It is the first time in the history of St. Louis policedom that a mother pleaded with her son to admit being a killer. While the son didn't do the killing, he has admitted being a member of the bandit gang which shot to her father. death Patrolman John Grogan and Harvey Hammett. Grogan, by the way at one time, rocked little Mary O'Flaherty to sleep—but that was in the days before the new horde took possession of Kerry Patch.

The mother single-handed obtained a confession from Maury after police methods had failed. Her story of obtaining the confession:

"His blue eyes looked up at me piteously when I went to his bedside at the hospital. I said to him, 'Maury, my boy, what have you done? They say you shot our old friend, Jonny Grogan.' A tear rolled down his cheek and he said, 'Mother, I didn't do it.'

"I sat down by the bed and stroked By United Press. his fevered head and implored him to tell the truth to ease his conscience. 'Son,' I said, 'remember the Lord says if your sins are as numerous as the sands of the sea they shall be forgiven.' Maury told me then and I told him to tell the officers, too, to ease his conscience and mine too.

"As a small boy, Maury attended St. Leo's school. He would come home at night and ask be to hear his prayers. 


