Preserve Fruit Enroute

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3 .- A new method for preservation of tropical fruits during long shipments has been invented by Dr. P. J. Cramer, director of the station for the selection of plants, at Buitzenzorg, Java, according to advices received from Harold D. Finley, American Consul at Naple TELEVISION ... Italy.

Cramer's method consists of cover ing the fruit picked slightly before maturity, with a thin coat of a liquid rubber preparation.

Each piece of fruit is then wrapped in waxed paper, thereby retarding the ripening period. The coating also prevents to a great degree the action of microbes which cause deterioration.




