Dr. Milling, who was convicted in Stephens county for practicing medicine without a license, appealed his case to the Court of Criminal Appeals. He pled that he professed to be a masseur, that he advertised himself as a masseur, and as a masseur he was exempt from the law. The law does exempt masseurs who limit their practice strictly to their particular sphere of labor.

The higher court held that where a masseur represents himself to be a masseur, but undertakes to cure any disease or disor-der by massage and charge for his services directly in cash or indirectly for room and board, he must first obtain a license to treat or offer to treat any disease or disorder.

The law provides that a person is practicing medicine when he treats or offers to treat any disease or disorder, mental or physical, or any physical deformity or injury by any system or method, or to effect cures thereof and charge therefor directly or indirectly, money or other compensation. He is practicing medicine if he holds himself out to be a physician.

This law has been held constitutional by the courts of Texas and by the Supreme Court of the United States.

The courts have held that the word "Physician" and "Doctor" are synonomous, that is they mean the same thing. The man who uses the word "Dr." before his name is thereby claiming to be a physician and hence must get a license before he can legally minister to the sick and afflicted in any way for pay.

But the law further provides that he does not have to profess to be anything at all in order to come within the regulations of to be anything at all in order to come within the regulations of the act passed to set up a fair standard for those who would make a business of ministering to the sick. If he follows the business of ministering to the sick by any method or system whatsoever, drugless or what not, he is required to obtain a license from an impartial scientific board of examiners and regis-tor his the District Clark's efficiency this county ter his license in the District Clerk's office of his county.
