## A good crowd attended the Town cities--even Meeting and Candidate Forum at Bearden said.

Friona Jr. High Cafeteria last Thursday evening. Bob Bearden, of Texas Comptroller John Sharp's office, explained the $1 / 2$-cent economic development tax, as well as the $1 / 2$ -
cent property tax abatement, which cent property tax abatement, which
Friona voters will decide on the
May 6 ballot.
In regard to the tax relief, City Manager Paula Wilson stated that if the proposition passes, the city should be able to reduce its ad
valorem tax rate by seven cents per
$\$ 100$ valuation. Mrs. Wilson told the Friona Star
that the seven-cent reduction would that the seven-cent reduction would
amount to $\$ 35.00$ for city taxes on amount to $\$ 35.00$ for city taxes on
a $\$ 50,000$ residence. "And, if we're able to attract
more businesses through the economic development program, this would mean more sales tax
collected and more savings to collected and more savings to
property owners," the city manager added.
Bearden pointed out that since 1989 a total of 89 Texas cities had adopted the economic development
tax. Of this number, 86 of the cities had approved the tax within the past 18 months.

Based on the one-cent tax that the city now receives from sales tax collections, the additional $1 / 2$-cen should raise around $\$ 55,000$ pe year for both the tax relief portion
and the economic development Bearden explained that if the measure passes, there would be a local board of directors which would have jurisdiction over how the money will be spent. "They will have to hold public meeting, with notice given as to what they are to discuss in rel.
to the money," Bearden stated. While there is much flexibility as to how the money can be spent, certain things are excluded, such as
using it for EMS purposes and using it for EMS purposes and

## Water Declines

Parmer County ground water
levels declined an average of 3.46 feet in 1994 in 97 privately-owned wells in the observation well
network maintained by the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 in its
546,400 acre service area within the county. This represents a decrease of 283,581 acre-feet of water in storage in the Ogallala Aquifer last year in the portion of Parmer
County within the Water District County within the Water District boundaries.
"Dry soil
past two years have increased the demand for ground water. In some heavy water use areas, there was a greater amount of decline in 1994 than in previous years," says Don
McReynolds, High Plains Water McReynolds, High Plains Water
District Technical Division Director. Wround water levels within the service area declined 1.57 feet during the 10 -year period from 1985
to 1995. An average annual decline of 2.32 feet was recorded during the five-year period from 1990 to 1995. Ground water levels in the Ogallala Aquifer within the 6.7 million acre Water District service area had an average decline of 2.15
feet from January 1993 to January 1994. This is a net decrease of about 2,160,750 acre-feet of ground water in storage in the Ogallala Aquifer within the Water District service area.
A zero average annual change in ground water levels was recorded for
