Compound Your Earnings With Dividend Reinvestment Albert Einstein once observed that the most powerful force is not
atomic energy, but the compounding of money. Compounding occurs when
investors put the interest and dividends earned on investments
back into their investments. This back into their investments. This
technique allows investments to grow more quickly than if investors were to take their eamings in cash. Compounding is familiar to many mutual fund shareholders, who often take advantage of a
