## foreign diplomats

Former U.S. ambassador Malcolm Toon has criticized the way this country selects its foreign diplomats.
Toon is the epitome of diplomatic professionalism. During his career he served as amba
Czechoslovakia, Israel and Russia.

HIS COMPLAINT is that sensitive U.S. diplomatic posts go not to career members of the Foreign Service but to men whose qualifications are measured by how much money they donate to and, unfortunately, it is not likely to change soon. Toon said in a recent interview that nearly half the U.S. am-
bassadors appointed by President Reagan got their posts for bassadors appointed by President Reagan got their posts for
political, not professional, reasons. John Gavin, for example, political, not professional, reasons. John Gavin, for example, former ambassador went on to criticize the ambassador ap pointments to Great Britain, France, West Germany and Italy
Toon, of course, is not without prejudice in this matter Toon, of course, is not without prejudice in this matter. As
career diplomat he obviously believes that foreign affairs career diplomat he obviously believes that iorethn affairs
should be left to career diplomats. But there is another impor tant consideration here. The president must have people in sen sitive diplomatic posts with whom he feels comfortable and in whom he has confidence. As long as the diplomatic appoint-
ments are not baldly irresponsible - and, over the years, some
have been - the president's wishes should be followed. STILL, GREATER care ought to be exercised in this
country's diplomatic appointments. Foreign nations study the country's diplomatic appointments. Foreign nations study the
U.S. ambassador as a sign of the importance America places on that country. Toon is probably over-rating the qualificications of
career diplomat, but there is little doubt that our relations with career diplomat, but there is little doubt that our relations with
a foreign country can be seriously harmed by appointing an a foreign country can be seriously
