## The bishop, the bomb

Amarillo bishop assails weapons plant
witita


Assailing President Reagan's decision last year to
produce and stockpile the neutron bomb, he said: "The matter is of immediate concern to us who live next
door to Pantex, the nation's final assembly point for nuclear weapons, including the neutron bomb. "We urge individuals involved in the production and
stockpiling of nuclear bombs to consider what they are doing, to resign from such a activities and to seek em
ployment in peaceful pursuit." What angered many in this largely Protestant city was that the homegrown boy was Leroy T. Mathiesen, bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Amarillo
"'rm shocked and surprised," said Amarillo Mayor Rick Klein when he heard of Matthiesen's statement.
He fretted that the bishop was neglect ing his church He fretted that the bishop was neglecting his church
duties o dable in matters far removed from his spiritual realim.
Althoug some
Although some hailed him as courageous, most local
critics tended to dismiss the bishop as "naive", Othe" Critics tended to dismiss the bishop as "naive." Others
were less charitable, including one letter writer who accused him of treason.
Nos mall number of Catholics, some of them Pantex employees, grumbled publicly that such matter
should be left to world leaders.
Aside from the controversy, the Matthiese statement's most immmediate efffect was to plunges the
bishop into a media whirl that took him around the country and onto national talk shows,
