not favorites. not favorites. By weighting
(cumulating) the votes in

default can offset and negate
the IIf the "favorites" position on the
board. being overridden creates
disharmony often leading to
confusion and resulting in bad confusion and resulting in bad
decisions.
Cumulative voting also lends itself to the election of candidates that have oneand bring out the votes for the supporting candidate. modern government complicated and requires
people with an open mind to
listen and weigh concerning all the issues so
that a fair decision can be made for the good of all the
citizens. I strongly urge all to
ignore the temptation to
weight your vote in favor of
any one candidate. Instead, any one candidate. Instead,
vote individually for the
candidates that would best serve the respective entities.
In so doing the strength of
the candidates will prevail the candidates will prevail
