A 1982 city charter amendment called for popular election of the mayor to a two-year term. Since 1946, the mayor has been appointed by the city council from within its ranks. Mayor Elmer Martin, a farmer, will be opposed by businessman J .0 . Dockery. Martin was appointed in 198 Colorado City Manager Rick Crowley said the ammendment to the chartar wated by the council a year ago. year ago.
