pilot of an American Airlines Boeing 727 carrying 116 people to make an emergency landing here.
The FAA spokesman in Fort Worth said that the plane, Flight 350 from El Paso to Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport, landed in Midland Wedrestay nigh
after losing oil pressure in one of its three engines. "He had his Number One engine out. It wasn't much

A sound defense also requires highly trained personnel in sufficient numbers o cope with emergencies. And, of course, there

THIS YEAR, PRESIDENT REAGAN asked Congress for a 10 percent increase in the military budget. He argues that the United States is behind the Soviet Union in its military capability and must add new w
deter Soviet aggression.
Congress must decide whether the president's request is reasonable or wheth
fective armaments. For example, the Army asks for huge new M-1 tanks that
have broken down in tests and need frequent refueling. The Navy wants expensive new aircraft carriers that would be The F-16 airplane rould
stimates The Thane would cost nine times more than original times estimates
Almost every new military system developed in recent years has been far more costly than original bids have indicated. Many of them are so complicated that operating manuals run hundreds of pages, and troops are unable to repair and main
tain them in the field. In short, much of th equipment that is costly and impractical.
