Doctor finds no proof armadillos spawn leprosy

VICTORIA, Texas (AP) - A Victoria physician who
specializes in skin disorders says there's no proof that specializes in skin disorders says there's $n$ proof that
four men who recently contracted leprosy contracted four men who recently contracted leprosy cont
the disease from armadillos they had handled. "Armadillos carry leprosy in significant numbers,"
said Dr. Gary F. Cox, a dermatologist. "But that does said Dr. Gary F. Cox, a dermatologist. "But that does
not prove these people caught leprosy from ar-
madillos. We don't even know if these armadillos had leprosy
Three of the men had cleaned armadillos for meat in
the past several months. The fourth had handled an armadillo carcass.
Researchers at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston reported in February that about 1 of every 20 armadillos carries leprosy, also known as
Hansen's disease. However, the study did not prove that humans can contract the disease from the Deaths

## The problem of 'deadbeat parents'

Eight million American children are being raised in homes in which a parent - usually the father - is absent. More than hal of the 8 million are supposed to receive court-ordered child fen the penalties for parents who defy such orders. Census Bureau figures tell a disheartening story: In 1981, less due; more than a third collected nothing at all. Overall, the na tion's children are deprived of $\$ 4$ billion a year in court-ordered support.
Partly because of the deficiency, more children are poor now han at any time since 1965. Of all children in female-headed amilies, 56 percent live in poverty, and the percentages fo figures is the Reagan administration's unwise cuts in program that help children and families in crisis. But if more absen parents obeyed child-support orders, children would be better off and so would taxpayers.
Several proposals soon to be considered in Congress would crack down on parents who refuse to pay - by imposing man datory wage withholding, intercepting tax refunds or ex incentives to the states to ensure vigorous erderoment of child support orders. Most congressmen agree the the new law Tough enforcement and tougher laws are part of the answer But, as Minnesota Rep. Bill Frenzel correctly argues, attitude must change as well
A co-sponsor of several child-support bills, Frenzel says tha he government alone cannot solve the problem of "deadbea support for what it is: child neglect.

As a teen-ager, VerVoort wanted to become a heart surgeon. That dream was snuffed when, a week befor high school graduation, he was in a car accident that
left him almost totally paralyzed Instead of giving up, he revised his career plans and now, at 27 , is beginning a three-year residency in
rehabilititative medicine at Baylor College of Medicine

Along the way he earned a degree in physiology from Southern Illinois University, membership in the Phi Beta Kappa honor society, and a medical degree from
the Medical College of Georgia.

VerVoort spent a month in intensive care and a year
in intensive rehabilitation after his accident. He in intensive rehabilitation after his accident. He
regained enough use of his arms to write, feed himself
and do other necessary tasks and and do other necessary tasks and later he learned to
walk with leg braces and crutches "My main goal was to get better so I could go to medical school," he said during a recent visit at his
mother's home here While in rehabilitation he developed "thousands of ideas about how I'd like to run things as a doctor because a lot of things I saw as a patient were wrong,"
VerVoort said. At one point after his accident, rehabilitation experts told VerVoort he would probably be forced to remain in

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: I am a male, age 38. In my ince I can remember - nothing more than a brown speck. However, within the last three years it has grown and is protruding. I feel a slight pain only when I

Please don't allow your fears stop you from seeing your doctor immediately. It's difficult enough for doctors to know what to do about moles, so it's even more
difficult and dangerous for you to try to judge for difficult and dangerous for you to try to judge for
yourself. So, the sooner the mole is treated, the better. That's also true, obviously, if there is a skin cancer present.
For you For you and for my other readers I'd like to list a few
features that suggest possible cancer of the skin, specifically where moles are concerned. A mole with a variety of colors (browns, blacks, reds, pinks, blue-
grays, and whites) can raise suspicions. If there is an irregularity to the mole's surface or ans irregularity to
its border, cancer may be present a its border, cancer may be present. A mole that
changes in color or size must be examined, as should changes in color or size must be examined, as should
one that bleeds or ulcerates. Pain is a late-appearing

become cancerous than those that appear ing a mole certainly should not cause a person undue concern; but it should be casually watched to note any
