LAREDO, Texas (AP) - Chair-

resources than during the "energy

not worse - situation today," Wallace told oil and gas executives Thursday. "The fact of the matter is, at this very moment we do not
have enough oil and gas for our own national security." Wallace called for a bipartisan
national energy national energy conference to
"outline the steps that must be taken to help, secure America's energy future.
The conferen
The conference, he said, should incluce congressional leaders,
federal energy officials, the public and representatives from energy producing states, major oil com-
panies and independent produceís.
Wallace seid Wallace said if foreign oil sup-
plies were shut off, the 350 million pies were shut off, the 350 million
barrels of oil in the Strategic Petroleum Reserve would last only 10 weeks. He said the United State has a 35 -day supply of gasoline, but
shortages caused by a foreign cutoff could affect motorists within three
days.

don the goal of energy selfsufficiency, a move Wallace called
a mistake with far-reaching
