Diverticulosis requires high fiber diet

Dear Dr. Donohue: Please elaborate on a diet for a person who has diverticulitis and a blood sugar count of 110. — M.D.L.

First of all, forget about your blood sugar count. That is normal. Now about the diverticulitis, which is inflammation of tiny pouches in the colon, the large bowel. I cannot give you a specific diet, but I can tell you that the diet is not at all like that for a person who has the pockets without inflammation.

Without the inflammation, the condition is diverticulosis, not "itis," and the diet is high-fiber. Fiber keeps moisture and prevents undigested food from drying, relieving much of the pressure inside the digestive tract.

But in diverticulitis, what you suffer from, the answer is a fluid diet to give the digestive tract a rest. In fact, in severe cases, only fluid by vein is given. You can see why your doctor has to be the one to give you a diet for this problem. The booklet "Don't Let Diverticulosis Throw You" discusses diverticulitis also. Dear Dr. Donohue: My mother is 77 and her ear itches, driving her crazy. She has been using ear drops. Can you tell her what to do for the problem? — Mrs. J.M.

I can't think of many conditions more disconcerting than an itching ear, so I sympathize with your mother. I can only suggest an answer. The ear canal is lined with skin that can be affected just as skin elsewhere in the body. Seborrheic dermatitis, eczema, reaction to some drugs, can cause the itching. So can allergies, also infections. Over zealous cleaning of ear canals can dry the skin and cause itching. And even eardrops can macerate the skin and lead to even greater itching.

What to do? After a thorough search for any of the causes mentioned, you can try ointments and creams instead of drops. They are better for many. Then, if it persists, the itching can be alleviated with a cortisone ointment.

Legal Affairs: court monitoring; communication network with local governments, police and other helping agencies; work to get laws passed and legislation introduced to help alleviate drug trafficking and court leniency.

Hotline/Shelter: Investigate resources, training and means to establish a 24-hour crisis and information hotline; sponsor a tipsy-taxi service; study long-term possibilities of a drug abuse shelter.

Media/Move/Music Monitoring: Gather statistics on advertising that put alcohol and drugs in a favorable stance; research the influence of the media on teens, youth and adult substance abuse; suggest TV, movie, and radio shows that are positive; discuss media awareness and its influence on us and how we think about drugs and alcohol; work closely with the Teens Against Drugs Task Force.

Jury awards judge \$11,000

AUSTIN (AP) — State District Judge Mary Pearl Williams was awarded \$11,000 Tuesday for a back injury received on an exercise machine at the Hills Fitness Center of Austin.

Mrs. Williams and her husband, Judge Jerre Williams of the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals, had asked \$650,000.

Final arguments for the Williams were presented by former Attorney General John Hill, now an Austin attorney.

The suit alleged Mrs. Williams injured her back May 5, 1980, while lifting weights on a machine. It was her first visit to the club and the machine was

being demonstrated by an employee.

The jury found that Mrs. Williams was 45 percent responsible for the injury and the fitness center 55 percent responsible.



Williams innocent of \$31 robbery

DALLAS (AP) — Anthony Williams, a 25-year-old black engineer charged in a controversial armed robbery case, was found innocent Tuesday by an all-white jury.

In closing arguments Tuesday, George Hairston, an NAACP attorney, had told jurors they would be sending a message across the nation about whether Dallas gives equal justice on the basis of race.

Hairston, of Brooklyn, N.Y., assisted in the armed robbery trial of Williams, charged with stealing \$31 from a 7-Eleven convenience store.

"This case is being watched by the whole country," Hairston said. "They are watching what you do about a \$30 robbery where there's a black man accused. They want to know whether Dallas renders blind justice, equal justice," he said.

The all-white jury began deliberations Tuesday at about 11:20 a.m. and returned its verdict about 3 p.m. Williams could have been sentenced to up to life in prison. Williams had claimed he was arrested because of his race and shoddy police work.

Hairston told the jury that "a chain suspicion" on the part of police mistakenly led to the defendant's indictment.

"Mr. Williams didn't come here to Texas to take a \$24,000-a-year job and jeopardize everything by robbing a store," Hairston said. During final arguments Tuesday, prosecutors asked the jury to convict Williams because he had been positively identified by the store clerk as the man who robbed her store on Aug. 22, 1982.

"Think of how your attention will be drawn if you walk out of court and some one walks up to you with a gun and says 'give me all your money,'" said prosecutor Barbara Gibbs.

She said Lyla Baggett, the store clerk at the 7-Eleven, would never forget the robber's face.

"Her eyes were on his face," Ms. Gibbs said. "I submit to you that that image is never going to be removed from her mind."

Prosecutor Steve Miller also told the jury their verdict would send a message to America.

"You can send a message out to the Lila Baggetts of the world. You can tell people that work alone that you are going to be protected by the law if you can positively identify" a robber, Miller said.

Mrs. Baggett testified last week that she had "no doubt" that Williams is the man who robbed her.

On Monday, Karen Moore, Williams' girlfriend, testified that she was with him in his Greenville apartment when the store was robbed.

When prosecutors asked her why she had not previously told police or investigators that information, Ms. Moore, who now lives with Williams in Garland, said she was originally uncertain about what night the robbery occurred.

Annette Loftin, another friend of Williams, testified she talked with him by phone in Greenville less than one hour before the Garland robbery.

Sizzling first half starts Hawks' win over LCC

The Howard College Hawks played 19:59 of their best basketball of the season during the first half of Tuesday night's game against Lubbock Christian College. The other second? It was lost somewhere in a malfunction of the clock but neither team missed the extra tick.

The Hawks forced the visiting Chaparrals into 17 turnovers, hit 50 per cent from the floor and ran away to a 54-14 lead in the first 19:59 of the game. The second half was set on cruise control with Howard easing down the road to its third straight victory with a lopsided 94-56 win over LCC.

Again the Hawks showed off its high-scoring wings. Dwight Harris scored 24 points while Jerry Stroman hit 12 of 16 shots on his way to a game and season high of 29 points. And, as Harris explains it, that's the game plan.

"What my role is," the sophomore from Americus, Ga., said, "when I get an open shot, shoot it and at times go one on one. Coach (Mike Mitchell) told me when I think I have the shot, take it."

"Jerry plays one wing and I play the other. Coach tells each of us to take the open shot and see what we can do. Sometimes he calls plays for Jerry and me so we can go one on one."

With graduated high-scorers Nate Givens and Leon Issac departed for various parts of the country, the scoring load has fallen on Harris and Stroman. But again, it was Howard's teamplay on defense that allowed the pair to display their skills.

Using a pressurized man defense, the Hawks knocked LCC's offense off keel. The Hawks took a half dozen charges near the basket while Stroman, Michael Porter and James Johnson played like pick-pockets on the Chap guards. Forced into hurried shots, LCC could sink just four of 20 attempts (20 per cent) in the half.

With the score tied 4-4, the Hawks hit a 29-2 scoring spurt that broke open the game. Mark Peters scored for Chaps with 13 minutes to play in the half and not until Vance Homer scored with 1:40 to go did

LCC hit another field goal. Howard's 26-15 edge on the backboards didn't hurt the team's drive to a 40-point intermission lead.

"I thought we played a good defensive game," Harris said. "We didn't play good defense against Wayland Baptist and Sul Ross but tonight we played real good defense. We were able to force a lot of turnovers."

Mitchell pulled his squad out of its man defense and pushed them back into a zone for the entire second half. The Chaps, playing an enthusiastic second half despite the difference in the score, began bombing away at the HC defense. Gary Hodges connected on six field goals, none shorter than 20 feet, as LCC played a highly respectable game in the final 20 minutes.

Harris and Stroman played little in the second half, Stroman quickly sinking six of nine shots before departing. Mitchell concentrated on giving his subs playing time as Howard never let the Chaps get any closer than 30 points.

Nicholas Jones hit a jump shot to give Howard an 80-47 lead and two free throws by Joe Johnson sent the Hawks over the 90-point mark for the second time this year.

James Johnson finished with 13 and Joe Johnson 10 points for Howard while Kent Reeves led LCC with 14 points. Joe Johnson grabbed 10 rebounds while James Johnson had seven for HC. Reeves led all rebounders with 12 for LCC.

Howard hit 53 per cent (35-67) from the floor while the Chaps dropped in 18 of 33 attempts (55 per cent) in the second half to finish the game at an overall mark of 42 per cent.

The Hawks play again Thursday at 5 p.m. against Barton County in the Chaparral Classic in Midland. The Hawks, win or lose, will play a second game Friday.

O'Brien resigns as NBA commissioner

NEW YORK (AP) — Larry O'Brien resigned today as commissioner of the National Basketball Association, effective Feb. 1, 1984, when his contract expires.

O'Brien, commissioner since June 1, 1975, said he had rejected a contract, offered by a four-member owners' committee, that would have run through the 1984-85 season.

"It is with decidedly mixed emotions that I stand before you," O'Brien said at a news conference. "The decision that led me to my announcement today was among the most difficult I have had to make."

"There were so many accomplishments of which I am proud and believe we have moved the NBA to the forefront of professional sports leagues. But there have been disappointments along the way and goals not realized."

Before succeeding the late Walter Kennedy as commissioner, O'Brien, 66, was best known

for his involvement in politics and as a skilled mediator.

He was one of John F. Kennedy's closest advisers during the 1960 presidential campaign and, after it, was named postmaster general.

O'Brien also served as an aide to President Lyndon Johnson; chairman of the Democratic National Committee during 1970-72; and director of Sen. George McGovern's unsuccessful presidential campaign against incumbent Richard M. Nixon in 1972.

It was O'Brien's office in the Watergate Hotel which was broken into, the spark which kindled the Watergate scandal.

Less than one year after O'Brien became NBA commissioner, the league ended an expensive war with the rival American Basketball Association by merging with the younger league, absorbing four of its franchises. The

Queens debut with win

Two scoring spurts leads HC by Ranger, 79-61

The best way to label Tuesday's Howard-Ranger game is "hully-gully." Twice the Queens strayed from that style of play and that was enough to send them to a win in their home-opener.

Howard put on a 16-2 scoring spurt in the first half and a 14-0 run in the second half, those two streaks leading the Queens past Ranger 79-61 in a game played at the old gymnasium on the HC campus.

The Queens turned the ball over eight times in the first seven minutes of play and fell behind Ranger 9-4. A free throw by Kari Robinson began the 16-2 spurt that propelled the Queens into the lead for good.

On both occasions — as it has in the Hawks' three previous games, it was the Queens' full-court pressure defense that turned the game around. Putting his quickest players on the court, coach Don Stevens saw his squad turn Ranger turnovers into easy layups.

Four Queens scored in double figures, something the team was not able to accomplish last season. "Last year," Stevens recalled, "we'd have someone with 36 and

then someone with eight. I was always fearful of that because someday I knew it would catch up to us. It's nice to see four or five in double figures."

Howard returns only two regulars off last year's Region V semi-finalist but a trio of newcomers is already making its mark.

Molley Early, from Houston Jersey Village, tossed in a game-high 18 points while Debbie Hall of Houston Cypress-Fairbanks added 11 points. Alex Provincio from El Paso Eastwood scored just six points but showed off her quickness around the basket.

Howard committed 26 turnovers in the game, the negative side of running a fast-break style game. However, the Hawk Queens made up for that with 48 per cent shooting from the floor (30-63). Ranger could sink just 37 per cent (23-63).

After recovering from its slow start, the Queens built a 16-point first half lead. Robinson sank a rebound basket just before the half to send HC into the locker-room with a 35-19 lead.

A three-point play by Lindsay Zachary, who scored 18 points for Ranger, brought the RangeAnns to within 40-26 with 16-22 to go.

Howard then reeled off 14 straight points to take a 54-26 lead.

Hall scored six of those points while Early added four more.

Stevens cleared his bench the rest of the way and the Queens stayed comfortably 20 points ahead despite 10 turnovers in the final 10 minutes of play.

Joining Early and Hall in double figures were freshman guard Shelly Kay with 12 and Robinson with 11. No other Ranger player scored more than 10 points besides Zachary.

The Queens, now 2-2, played again Thursday at 6 p.m. against Barton Co. in Odessa College's invitational tournament. HC tackles Kilgore at 4 p.m. Friday and Ranger again, at 6 p.m. Saturday to complete its tournament slate.

Murphy again named MVP

ATLANTA (AP) — Dale Murphy insisted he was surprised by his second straight National League Most Valuable Player award, but his philosophy makes the honor seem logical.

"In this game, if you're doing something right, you need to do it every year," the Atlanta Braves' center fielder said.

The Baseball Writers Association of America on Tuesday made Murphy the fourth NL player to win back-to-back MVP awards since the honor was created in 1931.

Murphy received 21 of 24 first-place votes cast by a panel comprised of two writers from each National League city. Andre Dawson of Montreal, Mike Schmidt of Philadelphia and Pedro Guerrero of Los Angeles each received one first-place vote.

Murphy had two second-place votes and one for fifth for 318 points as each panelist voted for 10 players. Dawson got 213 points, followed by Schmidt with 191 and Guerrero with 182.

Murphy led the league this year with 121 runs batted in and with a .540 slugging percentage. He was sixth in batting average (.302); second in runs scored (131); second in home runs (36); sixth in

hits (178); third in on-base percentage (.393); fourth in walks (90); and tied for fourth in game-winning RBI (14).

He also stole 30 bases to become the sixth major leaguer to hit 30 home runs and steal 30 bases in the same year.

At 27, Murphy is the youngest of the National Leaguers to win consecutive MVP awards. The others were the Cubs' Ernie Banks (1958-59), the Reds' Joe Morgan (1975-76) and Schmidt (1980-81).

Murphy is the second Brave to win the award. Henry Aaron won it in 1957.

Murphy will receive a \$100,000 incentive bonus, placed in his contract last year after his first MVP award. He has four years to go on a contract setting his base salary at \$1.3 million a year.

Last year, Murphy won the award despite a season-ending slump as the Braves won the West. This year, with slugging third baseman Bob Horner out of the lineup, Murphy carried the club through September.

Murphy joined the Braves from their Richmond farm club in 1977. In 18 games, he hit .316. The next season, he hit only .227, but he had 23 homers, and in 1979, his average climbed to .276 with 21 homers. He hit 33 homers in 1980, 13 in strike-interrupted 1981. In his first MVP year, he hit .281 with 36 homers and 109 RBI.

Hagler, Duran verbally spar in press meeting

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — Marvelous Marvin Hagler and Roberto Duran staged the usual pre-fight press conference with the usual gestures and threats, the usual disdain for the opponent and the usual demands to stage the bout right here and now.

It is, well, business as usual for a big fight. Somehow, they will control themselves and keep this \$20-million bout on hold until Thursday night when Hagler defends his undisputed middleweight championship against Duran.

The promotion put together by Top Rank and Caesars Palace has a huge revenue potential for the middleweight division. Hagler is guaranteed \$5 million and percentages of other income could push his total to \$8 million. Duran has a lower guarantee of about \$1.5 million, but his percentage trigger comes more quickly, and he could pocket \$4 million.

The show is scheduled for 400 closed circuit locations with three million seats. There is also pay-per-view television in Los Angeles and Chicago and, although sources at the fight are hesitant to talk about it, there also will be delayed home television showings by both NBC and Home Box Office later this month.

The money is nice, of course, but pride and prestige enter into this fight, as well.

"Two days, no more champion," said Duran, gesturing toward Hagler.

The champion laughed. "I thought the man can't speak English," he said. Both fighters finished sparring Monday and began tapering off Tuesday. They will rest today, weigh in early Thursday and then meet in the 15,200-seat stadium constructed in the parking lot outside Caesars Palace.

"I am ready in every area," said Hagler, who has defended his title seven times in the last three years, winning each fight with a knockout.

'84 Olympics tickets sent out in the mail

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Good news is on the way for many of the Americans requesting tickets to the 1984 Olympics. For others, there's bad news — the check's in the mail.

After a two-month "Herculean effort" to process 279,000 ticket orders worth \$65 million, the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee has begun mailing confirmation notices to lucky applicants who have 2.1 million tickets reserved for the Summer Games.

In a status report Tuesday, LAOOC officials called the \$10-million project "the most monumental ticket distribution job undertaken in history."

With the help of computers operating on a 24-hour basis since Aug. 15, the LAOOC said the complex task was "extremely successful" and "fair."

Ninety percent of those who ordered by Aug. 15 will get some tickets, but only 20 percent will get what they wanted.

The 90 percent includes those on waiting lists, but LAOOC officials predict chances are better than 50-50 they will receive what they requested.

Tickets will be mailed next spring, in time for the July 28-Aug. 12 Games. Another \$68 million worth of refunds will go to those who lost in the random selection process for the oversubscribed events.

The heavy demand has resulted in sellouts to all sessions of eight events — including gymnastics and swimming plus opening and closing ceremonies — but more than three million tickets to 244 events in 20 sports are still available.

The LAOOC is attempting to make the 1984 Games the first in modern times to operate without taxpayer support.

Refunds will be sent beginning this week, more than 60 days ahead of schedule, to those who did not get ticket reservations, said Harry L. Usher, LAOOC general manager.

In order to qualify, would-be ticket buyers had to send in their money between June 14 and Aug. 15.

Ticket demand for the Games was far greater than anticipated, Usher said.

"We had 275 events go into random selection out of the possible 370. That was three times what we expected," said Ed Smith, LAOOC ticketing vice president.

A total of 5.3 million, or 70 percent of the 7.7 million Olympic tickets, were made available to the U.S. public. The rest went to foreigners, Olympic officials, athletes, coaches, sponsors and the news media.

Sixty-five percent of the ticket orders came from Southern California.

A ticket sellout of every event would produce \$80 to \$90 million of the LAOOC's projected \$474 million budget.

Diane Calley of Energas presented "Christmas in the Kitchen" at the Flame Room of Energas, Nov. 2. Dressed in a Christmas apron, Diane demonstrated some of the recipes in a cookbook she presented her guests and some craft ideas. She also gave tips for preparing the other recipes.

Diane's demonstrations are always appreciated by her audience. When she comes to town she usually presents two demonstrations. They are usually advertised a day or two in advance in the Herald.

I make a point to see the demonstrations because they are excellent. I suggest you see them too. You will enjoy them. Today's Recipe Exchange features some of Diane's recipes and tips for those who didn't get to see the demonstration.

We have some recipe requests. Evangeline Soosa would like a recipe for Pea Salad to serve at Thanksgiving. Iris Correa tried Fried Cheese at Pelican's in Odessa and loved it. She wants to know if anyone has a recipe for it.

HOLIDAY SAUSAGE

Diane Calley
This recipe includes the use of Tender Quick Salt. Tender Quick is a curing salt. This dish is spicy and hot.

- 2 lbs. ground beef (not extra lean)
- 1 cup water
- 2 1/2 Tbsps. Tender Quick Salt (available in grocery or specialty food stores)
- 2 tps. liquid smoke
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp. dry mustard
- Coarse ground pepper (optional — makes sausage hot)

Combine beef with water, mixing well. Blend in remaining ingredients, except pepper. Form a beef mixture into 1 or 2 log shapes and roll in pepper, if desired. Wrap roll(s) in aluminum foil and refrigerate 24 hours. Punch holes in bottom of foil and place on broiler pan with 1/4 inch water in bottom of broiler pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Refrigerate roll for easier slicing. Serve as an appetizer with assorted cheese and crackers. Serve with Sweet and Spicy Mustard for a tart flavor.

SWEET AND SPICY MUSTARD

- Diane Calley
- 1/4 cup plus 1 tbsp. dry mustard
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 Tbsp. flour
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - Dash of red pepper
 - 2 eggs, beaten
 - 1/4 cup vinegar

1 Tbsp. butter or margarine
Combine mustard, sugar, flour, salt and red pepper in top of double boiler. Add eggs and vinegar, blending thoroughly. Place over boiling water; cook, stirring constantly until thickened. Add butter; stir until melted. Cool mixture; then store in a jar in the refrigerator. Makes 1 1/2 cups.

MIXED VEGETABLE SALAD

1 pkg. (10 ounce) frozen mixed vegetables
3/4 cup sliced celery
1/4 cup diced cucumber
2 Tbsps. chopped onions
1/4 cup diced green pepper
1/4 cup chopped sweet pickle
1/2 cup French dressing
4 to 6 lettuce cups
Cook frozen vegetables as directed on package, until barely tender. Drain well and mix with other vegetables. Pour French dressing over vegetables. Toss lightly. Spoon into individual lettuce cups to serve. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

CAJUN CORNBREAD

Diane Calley
This recipe is a spicy casserole. Serve it with the Mixed Vegetable Salad. This recipe can be baked in two 8" x 8" pans instead of one 13" x 9" baking dish. By doing this you can eat half of it now and freeze the rest for later.

- 1 cup corn meal
 - 1 cup buttermilk
 - 1/2 tsp. soda
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 1 (8 1/2-ounce) can cream style corn
 - 1/2 cup bacon drippings
 - 2 eggs, well beaten
 - 1/2 lb. ground beef
 - 2 cups cheddar cheese, grated
 - 1/2 cup onions, chopped
 - 2 jalapeno peppers, chopped or green chili Okra, optional
- Mix first 7 ingredients together; set aside. Brown ground beef; drain. Add cheese, onion and peppers. Lightly sprinkle corn meal on bottom of 13" x 9" baking dish. Pour 1/2 corn bread mixture in pan; add meat mixture and top with remaining corn bread mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Yield: 12 to 15 servings.

To prepare the frozen Cajun Cornbread, thaw it and bake it covered with foil. This will keep it moist.

PUMPKIN DREAM PIE

This pie is quick to make if pie crust is made ahead of time. Make several of the pie crusts and freeze them until ready to make this pie or others. The frozen crust will keep three to four months.

- Crust:
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter or margarine

- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup chopped pecans (reserve 2 Tbsps.)

Pie filling:
1 pkg. instant vanilla pudding
1 can sweetened condensed milk*
1 cup pumpkin, solid pack
1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice (or 1 tsp. cinnamon, 1/2 tsp. ginger and 1/4 tsp. cloves)
1 cup whipped cream or whipped topping (reserve some for garnish)

Combine butter, flour and pecans, blending well. Press into 8 or 9 inch pie plate. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes. Allow to cool. Combine remaining ingredients and pour into cooled crust. Garnish with reserved chopped pecans (or whole pecans), whipped cream dollops and topped with a glazed cherry cut in a holly fashion.

*For a homemade substitute for sweetened condensed milk, combine 1 cup non-fat dry milk, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup boiling water and 3 Tbsps. melted butter or margarine in a blender. Mix well. This is equivalent to one can sweetened condensed milk.

IGLOOS

Diane Calley
1 box coconut-pecan frosting mix
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/4 cup milk
1 (8-ounce) can crushed pineapple, drained well
1 pkg. (8-ounce) butter-flavored cookies (rings)
1 carton whipped dairy topping
10 maraschino cherries

Mix first three ingredients in 1-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until margarine is melted. Cook and stir until smooth, 1 minute longer. Stir in pineapple until well blended. Spread mixture on 3 cookies, stack and gently press together. Top with plain cookie. Repeat for 10 stacks, 4 cookies each. Place stacks on tray or baking sheet. Let stand at room temperature at least 8 hours or overnight until cookies are very soft. Spread sides and top of stacked cookies with dairy topping. Gently pat and sprinkle coconut to coat. Top each igloo with a cherry. Refrigerate up to 3 days. Makes 10 servings.

For variation: Instead of filling suggested (1st three ingredients), use chocolate frosting mixed with a little bit of flavored extract (such as spearmint) and let it set out at room temperature for a while before spreading on the cookies. Igloos also can be decorated with spearmint candy or red hots in place of the maraschino cherries.

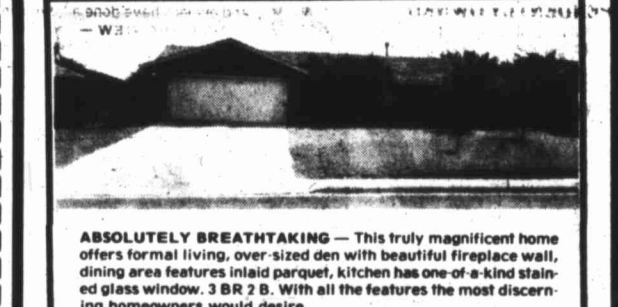

County murder suspects found

A 36-year-old man being held in Jacksonville, Fla., on suspicion of murder has been identified as a suspect in two 1982 murders in Howard County, according to Howard County law enforcement agencies.

The suspect, who was interviewed Thursday in Jacksonville by Texas Ranger Charles Brune and a Howard County sheriff's deputy, confessed to the murders of two men whose bodies were later found in or near Big Spring, Howard County Sheriff A.N. Standard said today.

According to Standard and Brune, the suspect confessed to the murder of Happy Howry, 66, of Odessa, whose body was found May 8, 1982 beneath bushes in a field near the 500 block of Sunset Boulevard in west Big Spring about a week after he was reported missing on April 25, 1982 from Odessa. Howry was the manager of the shoe department at the Odessa J.C. Penney's store at the time of his death.

Howry's car, a 1980 gold and tan Chevrolet Malibu Classic, was found on April 28, 1982 just a few blocks from the Big Spring police station in the 100 block of South Nolan, police said. Blood stains in the trunk area of the car led police to suspect foul play, they said.

Police said they believe Howry was killed between 2 p.m. and 9 p.m. April 29, 1982, the day he was reported missing after he failed to return home after eating Sunday dinner at his mother's house.

According to an autopsy performed by Dr. Robert Rember, Howry was killed by a crushing blow to the skull with a blunt instrument. He had received numerous blows to the head.

Standard and Brune said the suspect also confessed to the June 1, 1982 murder of William Boyd Hite, 22, of Meridian, Miss., whose body was found on FM 2599 just off Interstate Highway 20 west of Big Spring. Hite, who had been hitchhiking, died from numerous gunshot wounds to the body, according to an autopsy performed by Rember.

Hite's body was found at 3:45 p.m. on June 1, 1982 by

a Texas Highway Department maintenance crew, who notified the sheriff's office.

Law enforcement officials said Hite may have been shot one time while he was standing on F.M. 2599 and at least five times while he was lying on the pavement. According to a teletype sent at the time the body was discovered from the sheriff's office to other law enforcement agencies along I.H. 20, Hite was shot seven times with a .38 or .357-caliber weapon.

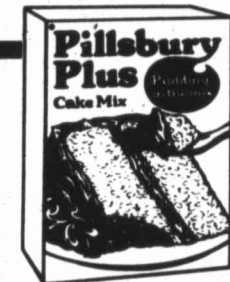


