Greyhound strike continues PHOENIX - Greyhound buses rolled in 27 states
Friday with less of the violence that marked the first day's resumption of limited service, and striking union eaders predicted their members would reject a comany wage and benefit reduction proposal

100 the day before. In Boston, demonstrators again threw eggs and taunted departing drivers as "scabs" "trying to stay awake."

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate confirmed William P. Clark as secretary of the interior Friday, ejecting complaints by administration critics that the appointment signaled a continuation of the pro
development policies of his predecessor, James Watt.
The Senate approved President Reagan's nomina-1-18. Several of those voting for Clarks said their decision was based on a belief that the president was entitiment with administration policies.
Clark also had many supporters in his own right.
