came to this West Texas city in the late 800 to work on railroad projects. He said other objects that have been
dug up include ceramic bowls and soup
spoons, wine jars and spoons, wine jars and pottery.
Most of the material was discovered between two feet and eight feet under a
paved parking lot near the historic Cortez
Hotel in downtown EI Paso, Batcho said.

 proposition" said Edward $\mathbf{R}$. Grotpeter. "It is alreadya viable situation." In an interview Friday, Grotpeter said he had sent the $\$ 2.5$ million offer late Thursday to the Herald Co.'s attorneys in New York. Included in the offer was the tising information.
Grotpeter publishes a magazine for hotel guests in Grotpeter publishes a magazine for hotel guests in
St. Luis, New York and Houston. He also operates a tourist tram service in downtown St. Louis.
William E. Willis, a Herald Co. attorney, said that he Herald Co. had only a "non-committal letter from a bank" on Grotpeter's behalf. He declined to comment Potential bidders for the Globe-Democrat have only
until the close of business Monday to send financial data and publication plans to Herald Co. attorneys or the U.S. Department of Justice, which is overseeing he closing of the newspape
If no satisfactory plan surfaces, the Justice Deopartment will approve the Globe-Democrat's plan to cease publication on
Mark Sheehan.
The department is monitoring the closing because of he joint operating agreement the newspaper has with
he Pulitzer Publishing Co.'s St. Lowis Post-Dispatch under the Newspaper Preservation Act. The act exempts the newspapers from certain provisions of anuns laws
Grotpeter said he had complied with the Justice
