Bud Hughes, at whose home Knott residents
met Friday to discuss the situation with
representatives from the Odesso office of the
state Department of Agriculture, side he did
not intend to purchase a water treatment
system.
'Tm not (buying a distiller or a reverse
osmosis plant) til the ag guys come up with
something to water cows and horses," Hughes
said.
Joe Barnes, who lives northeast of Knott,
said he did not plan on purchasing a system
but might later if the arsenic contamination
> "Six months from now, if the contamination continually rises, I might," Barnes said.

said the high cost of the water treatment systems forced them to wait anc see if the

from lake water. He also said he didn't think arsenic was present in the insectiside farmer used on their fields.
Bill Rogers, who also is with the
agricultural department's Odessa office, said agricultural department's Odessa office, said
that although arsenic acid is present in the defoliant farmers used, "It doesn't leach. You put it on the ground and it stays there."
Both Davis and Rogers say they are unable to tell anything about the arsenic contamination based on location. tion based on location.
"tt's too early to have a pattern," Davis
said. "We're waiting for more test results."
