Henry Lee Lucas, charged with two Howard County
murders, has been indicted by a Dade County grand jury on three first-degree murder charges.
The 47 -year-old drifter, charged with five other murders in Texas and convicted in three killings, is the alleged companion of Ottis Ellwood Toole, the man
who confessed to the 1981 kidnapping and murder of 6-year-old Adam Walsh from a Hollywood, Fla., mall.
Toole's attorney later said his client had recanted the confession.
Dade prosecutor George Yoss said authorities will proceed with the cass, although he acknowledged
chances are "relatively slim" that Lucas will be tried on the Dade charges. "We have an obligation to enforce the laws of
Folorida and a duty to pursue him," Yoss said after the Lucas is on trial on a murder charge this week in San Angelo, Texas, and is awaiting trial in week in in other
Texas counties and in Louisiana on other murder charges.
Lucas has been charged locally with the murder of Happy Howry, 66, of Odessa. Howry's body was found May 8, 1982, beneath bushes in a field near the 500
block of Sunset Boulevard in west Big Spring. He was

## Deadly genie of poison gas

That war is hell is one of the oldest truths in human experience, but the war between Iran and Iraq is reaching a leve of barbarity that is especially appalling. Reports after humanwave attacks by the Iranians. Some of the Iranian "troops" are said to be no more than schoolboys, as young as 12 .
In the Middle East, the clash of armies with bloody results is not in itself unfamiliar, so the most alarming development may be the evidence that Iraq is using poison gas to repel massive assaults by Iran. In spite of the other brutalities of modern war until recently.
There is compelling evidence that chemical weapons originating in the Soviet Union have been responsible for death and injury from "yellow rain" in Southeast Asia and Afghanistan. The Soviet Union is the chief supplier of arms to Iraq. Is it only a coincidence that these reports of a resort to chemical warfare involve only the Russians and their clients?
Iran has asked the United Nations to investigate the evidence of the use of mustard gas by the Iraqis. Considering the difficulty in getting the United Nations to embark on any project poten ially embarrassing to the Soviet Union, that avenue does no ook especially promising. Pressure on Iraq and any other na ions resorting to chemical weapons may have to come from overnments acting on their own initiative
This is a genie that must be put back in its bottle. Internachemical or biological weapons are of poison gas and othe field of disarmament that have succeeded in limiting the scope of warfare since World War II. Violations must not be allowed to take place without international sanctions against the

doesn＇t make sense to me if it＇s true．－Mrs．T．L． Answers to simple questions usually aren＇t short or simple．High blood pressure begins with a very It is a loss of control of what，for want of a better term． we can call＂little faucets＂at the ends of capillaries． They normally open and close automatically to permit local body needs． Let me explain．When we exercise，the capillary faucets controlling blood supply to these muscles open
And simultaneously，those serving areas in less im－ mediate need of blood supply（digestive organs，for ex ample）close．This occurs in hundreds of variations minute－to－minute，hour－to－hour throughout our lives．
High blood pressure begins with loss of that complex faucet control．We are not sure why it happens．The faucets just close and more or less stay that way，the
obvious result being a backup of blood pressure obvious result bei
through the system．

This brings us to your question about high blood This brings us to your question about high blood
pressure and poor circulation．The next step in the pro－ cess is a wear－and－tear action of the chronically tuevated blood pressure against artery walls．Even－
tually，this produces a roughening of those walls，an ideal environment for depositing of fatty substances in the blood．With the deposits comes a narrowing of the
arteries and a conseguent worsening of the already arteries and a consequent worsening of the already
high blood pressure（and poor circulation）from fat clogged arteries．
Dear Dr．Donohue：What is your opinion of hyper－
baric oxygen therapy for stroke rehabilitation？－S．L． My opinion of it is based upon reports from studies conducted since the idea gained some popularity in the
