## Editorial Never cry bat over your kids

One needn't be a parent familiar with end-of-the-school-day
stampedes and scout jamborees to sympathize with the plight stampedes and scout jamborees to sympathize with the pight
of the poor Mexican free-tailed bat. In spring, the female of this species can find herself living in a cave in Texas with as many
as 70 million other bat mothers and babies - some 40 million of the latter clinging to every 15 square inches of cave wall, and every one of them screaming in hunger by the time the mothers come back from work at dawn. Yet each bat mother is supposed to find in that horde her very own pup to nurse.
Human scientists, probably reflecting on their own difficulties at even a moderately full playground, have generally assumed that the task was impossible - that, in fact, bat babies
were nursed communally by whichever females got to them first. But Dr Gary F McCracken of the University of Texas recently tested the hypothesis, by plucking nursing couples of the walls and taking samples of their genes. He found that only 17 percent of the females were nursing pups demonstrably not their own, and under the circumstances, he considers that suc cess rate remarkable.
The next question is obvious: How do they do it? The studies aren't complete, but McCracken is working on the theory that each mother calls for her pup and listens for the distinctive
sound of her own offspring's response. In the cacophony of 70 million mothers and babies all calling and responding at once, that doesn't seem to be quite enough of an explanation. Neither does McCracken's backup theory of a final sniff test.

Combining regular exercise with a well-balanced

Stress can break your heart

DALLAS (AP) - Stress can break some people's
hearts. Stress is also responsible for at least half of the heart disease that occurs, according to a Phoenix car-
diologist addressing heart specialists at a meeting of diologist addressing heart specialists
To dramatize his report that stress can precipitate
heart disease and is a major factor in 1200 sudden deaths each year in America, Robert S. Eliot persuaded doctors into a booth at the Dallas Convention Center, where they were given the chance to sit in an
easy chair and play "Breakout," a video game. Most of the physicians appeared calm Monday
they played. But after 15 minutes, blood pressure cuft around their arms showed that one in five of the do tors had reacted to the stress of playing the game as if they were "fighting a saber-toothed tiger."
They are what Eliot calls "hot reactors They are what Eliot calls "hot reactors" - people
whose bodies react strongly to stress and thus are more susceptible to heart disease.

Eliot reported that his study of more than $4,000 \mathrm{men}$
and women has shown that stress can cavse death and women has shown that stress can cause death
from heart disease just as much as obesity, a highfrom heart disease just as mucs as obesity, a high
cholesterol diet, high blood pressure or diabetes. "Hot reactors burn a dollar's worth of energy for a
dime's worth of trouble," Eliot told his colleagues. dime's worth of trouble," Eliot told his colleagues.
"These are people who are driving 75 miles an hour "These are people who are driving 7 miles an the brakes on. Their engines are burning up."

This reaction to stress, he said, can cause blood
pressure to rise sharply, increase the heart rate and constrict blood vessels, making them more resistant to
the flow of blood. the flow of blood.
"Cholesterol is important, but it can be raised as
much by stress as by diet," he said ""You can't much by stress as by diet,", he said. "You can't get
your cholesterol down until the person gets control over their lives."
