Many of the costs of raising a child are "hidden" in regular family expenses. The USDA research
calculated costs for food at home; school lunches calculated costs for food at home, school lunches

shelter, fuel, utillities, household operations, fur shishings ind equi, equipment, $)$, medical care, education
ntans
