Everyone is invited to come and enjoy a delicious breakfast and fellowship.


Friona ISD board election

AMENDMENT XXIII

Passed by Congress June 16, 1960 and ratified March 29, 1961.


Section 1.

The district constituting the seat of Government of the United States shall appoint in such manner as Congress may direct:

A number of electors of President and Vice President equal to the whole number of Senators and Representatives in Congress to which the District would be entitled if it were a State, but in no event more than the least populous State; they shall be in addition to those appointed by the States, but they shall be considered, for the purposes of the election of President and Vice President, to be electors appointed by a State; and they shall meet in the District and perform such duties as provided by the twelfth article of this amendment.

Are you confused? This amendment grants Washington, D.C. 3 electors to the Electoral College. Do you know what the Electoral College is?

on her door. I haven't spoken to her in a little while but the last time we spoke, she was no longer on Ambien and dealing with insomnia.

"Damned if you do, damned if you don't," was her answer.

A few months back I was having a hard time sleeping and talked to my doctor and he recommended Ambien. I told him I would rather not sleep than take Ambien. After a long and confusing excuse, from me, he gave me a prescription for Lunesta. It worked but I had to have counseling while I was taking it. It worked (no after midnight snacks or driving) and I got past my sleepless-

I am sure there are those out there that can take Ambien and not have a problem but no one person is like another. Maybe that is why the commercials take so long with the side effects.

Sleeplessness is pretty bad but the side effects of sleeping medication can sometimes be worse. Remember to read the label before taking any medication and call your doctor if something odd happens. I don't want you brought home by the police or gaining extra weight and not remembering anything.


