No amendment shall be made to the Constitution, which will authorize or give to Congress the power to abolish or interfere f persons held to labor or service by the laws of said State.

This Amendment was proposed and passed by the 36th Congress on March 2, 1861 and submitted to the state legislature for ratification. Technically still pending it would make "domestic ment procedures enshrined within Article 5 of the United States Constitution. It was ratified by three states: Ohio, Maryland and Illinois.
