

The Friona Cemetery will once again be filled with flags in remembrance of our veterans this Memorial Day, Monday May 26.


Friday May 23 Friona Cub Scouts will be at the cemetery at 6 p.m. to assist the American Legion in putting flags on the graves of veterans.

Graduation ceremonies for the Class of 2014 will be held Friday May 30 at 8:00 p.m. at Chieftain Field.








Mike has two brothers, Stephen and Nicholas. He is the son of Fidel and Mary Ortiz of Friona.


