WASHINGTON - It's not a pretty Christmas pic fire: thousands of starving Ethiopians plodding mile the sun-parched plains, trying desperately to make it oxhaustion camp before they die of starvation and exhaustion. Many - too many - die even after they
have found help in the camps, their bodies too ravag. ed to respond to food and medical care. The horror of Ethiopia was news to a shocked extent of the disaster by a report on NBC-TV But to the volunteers of the International Rescue

ago by Albert Einstein to aid refugees from Nazi

A healthy infant is placed in its crib for a nap or for the night and is later found dead. Autopsies reveal
no cause. All that is left is the imno cause. All that is left is the im-
precise diagnosis - sudden infant
death syndrome. death syndrome. In replying to
you, let me answer some of the you, let me answer some of the
more commonly asked questions more commonly assed questions
on SIDS that appear in my mail. Parents who face this tragedy
must realize that nothing could must realize that nothing could
have been done either by them or by anyone else to prevent it , so

Striking coal miner's children feeling pinch

FERNDALE, Wales (AP) - Five-year-old Neil
Evans, whose father has been on strike for more Evans, nine months, is getting secondrand toys this Christmas. His sister Amanda, 13 , is getting a s $\$ 6$ gift
certificate from the miners' union - and $n o t h i n g ~$ from her mother.
With Britain's coal strike in its 41st week,
