

The trial of Leon Czolgosz for the murder of President McKinley began Monday the 23 inst in the supreme court of Erie county, Judge Truman C. White presiding. The building in which the trial is to be held was completely surrounded by mounted officers and no one except the crowd in the building which amounted to about one hundred and fifty persons was allowed to see the prisoner who was led from the jail to the city hall through an underground tunnel.
