BIG FIRE AT ASPERMONT.

Business Part of the Flourishing Town of Aspermont in Ashes—Loss Will Reach up Into the Thousands—Thought to be the Work of Incendiary.

A disastrous fire at Aspermont destroyed several thousand dollars worth of property on the morning of the 16th instant. The loss was partially covered by insurance. The following, taken from the Aspermont Star, is a list of the houses destroyed:— W. A. Huntsman's store. Loss about \$4000.00. Insured for \$3175.00. Quite a lot of merchandise was saved. The post-office was in this building, but most of the supplies were saved. G. S. Avery's building and contents. Loss \$1000.00. Insured for 400.00. This was the building in which Rush Mitchell is running a saloon. Mitchell's loss was about \$1500.00. No insurance. Harvey & Tanner's two story rug house. Loss to building and drugs about \$4000.00. Insured for \$2000.00. Quite a lot of drugs were saved. The upper story of this building was being used for offices and a lodge room, and the following losses were sustained: I. O. O. F.'s loss about \$500.00. No insurance. Holcomb & Shrewsbury's loss in books about \$400.00. No insurance. Forrester & Bussey's loss in books, stationery, etc., about \$250.00. No insurance. Wm. Jordan's loss in books, stationery, etc., about \$100.00. No insurance. First National Bank. Loss about \$1250.00. Insured for \$750.00.

REPORT OF GRANDJURY.

Following is the Report of the Grandjury After Five Days Investigation—Believe Law Breaking is on the Decline in Scurry County.

Snyder, Tex., March 21, 1902. To Hon. P. D. Sanders, District Judge, 39th Judicial District of Texas.

We, the grandjurors, for the March term of the district court of Scurry county, Texas, beg leave to submit the following report:

We have inquired into all matters that have come to our knowledge to the best of our ability, and from our investigation we are inclined to think that the violations of law are on the decline in this county.

We find there have been some grave offenses committed for which we are unable to find sufficient evidence and refer same to the next grandjury for investigation.

We recommend that the commissioner's court be required to use more care in receiving, comparing and approving of all reports made by the officers of this county and that they be required to make their reports according to law and that the books be kept more correctly.

We further recommend that the public roads in this county be put in better shape, and that road overseers be required to do their duty and comply with the law. Respectfully submitted, J. WRIGHT MOGAR, Foreman.

THE SEWELL TRIAL.

The trial of the Sewell case has occupied the attention of district court since Monday. The defendant Sewell resides at Haskell where he is alleged to have committed an outrage against his step-daughter Lizzie Smith. The grand jury at Roby returned an indictment and the case was brought here for trial. Some twenty-five or thirty witnesses were examined and all the testimony was not received until noon Tuesday when the case was turned over to the lawyers for argument which was concluded Thursday afternoon. At the time of going to press the case is in the hands of the jury. Owing to the gravity of the charges and the punishment attached thereto the case has excited more than ordinary interest.

LATER: The jury after being out about two hours returned a verdict of guilty, assessing the punishment at 30 years confinement in the penitentiary.

ANOTHER RAILROADER.

We Print Below a Part of a Letter Received by W. W. Nelson From J. C. Smith Relative to a Railroad Proposition.

Say how bad do those people want a railroad to Snyder, and what royalty would they be willing to pay for a road to the town? I am getting up the plans and cost of expenses of constructing a line in to Snyder from the T. & P. and if the people of Snyder will do the right thing by me I will give them a call. I want right of way and royalty, and if the people will get together and say whether they are willing to have a road and have their freight delivered to them same day it arrives in Colorado, or where ever this branch might start from, at the rate of about 10 or 15 cents per hundred how long would it take for them to get their money back if they should give \$5000, or \$7000, appropriation to this enterprise. It would not take long and would enhance the value of land to double the amount of its present value. I can interest capital in this enterprise from this country and will not take long to raise the amount to meet the whole expense, I have some money of my own and expect to secure right of way and franchise at my own expenses so as to gain confidence of capital. I am determined to build this road if the people want it and will do the right thing. This will help Snyder more than any thing that could be done, it will put new life in the country and will build up the country more in one year than can be at any other way in five years. So I will close hoping to hear from you as soon as you have leisure to answer. Give my best regards to all of my old time friends and to your self and family.
