## Whistle-blowers

 deserve rewardIn moving to renow- a government whictie-hlower nomoram oredo has expanded it in an important way by including for the first time uniformed armed forces personnel. Rep Schroeder's bill, which the House has already passed 413-1, provides for cash rewards for federal employees who reveal

waste, fraud and mismanagement - awards of up to $\$ 10,000$ or 1 percent of the savings involved, whichever amount is smaller. She said she is confident that the program will save taxpayers from having to pay for such military extravagance as $\$ 7,200$ coffeepots. Whether that is certain or not, the program is still worth continuing. During the five years after the program was approved in 1978 , the General Accounting orred more than 10,600 allegations to"federal investigative units. About 1,100 allegations were șubstantiated and millions of dollars in excessive spending were uncovered. Yet a three-year renewal bill was
killed last year at the last minute when the Reagan adkilled last year at the last minute when the Reagan ad-
