



- 2. Medicare Advantage Plans are not supplemental insurance plans. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan, you cannot be sold a supplemental plan and must pay 100% of any deductibles and co-payments associated with your plan.
- 3. You can purchase a Medicare drug plan without enrolling in Medicare Advantage.
- 4. If you enroll in a Medicare Advantage Plan, your doctor and other providers may not be in-network for this plan. As a result, you may not be able to use — or may have to pay more to use — Parmer Medical Center and Friona Rural Health Clinic.
- 5. If you do not comply with Medicare Advantage Plan rules, such as pre-authorization, your out-of-pocket costs may increase, or your coverage could be denied leaving you responsible for all charges.
- 6. In order to avoid charges for services not covered by your plan, please check your enrollment status and let your provider know if you have enrolled in any Medicare Advantage Plan or Medicare Drug Plan before you request services.
- 7. If you are already in a Medicare Advantage Plan, you can switch back to traditional Medicare from October 15 through December 7 by calling 1-800-Medicare.
